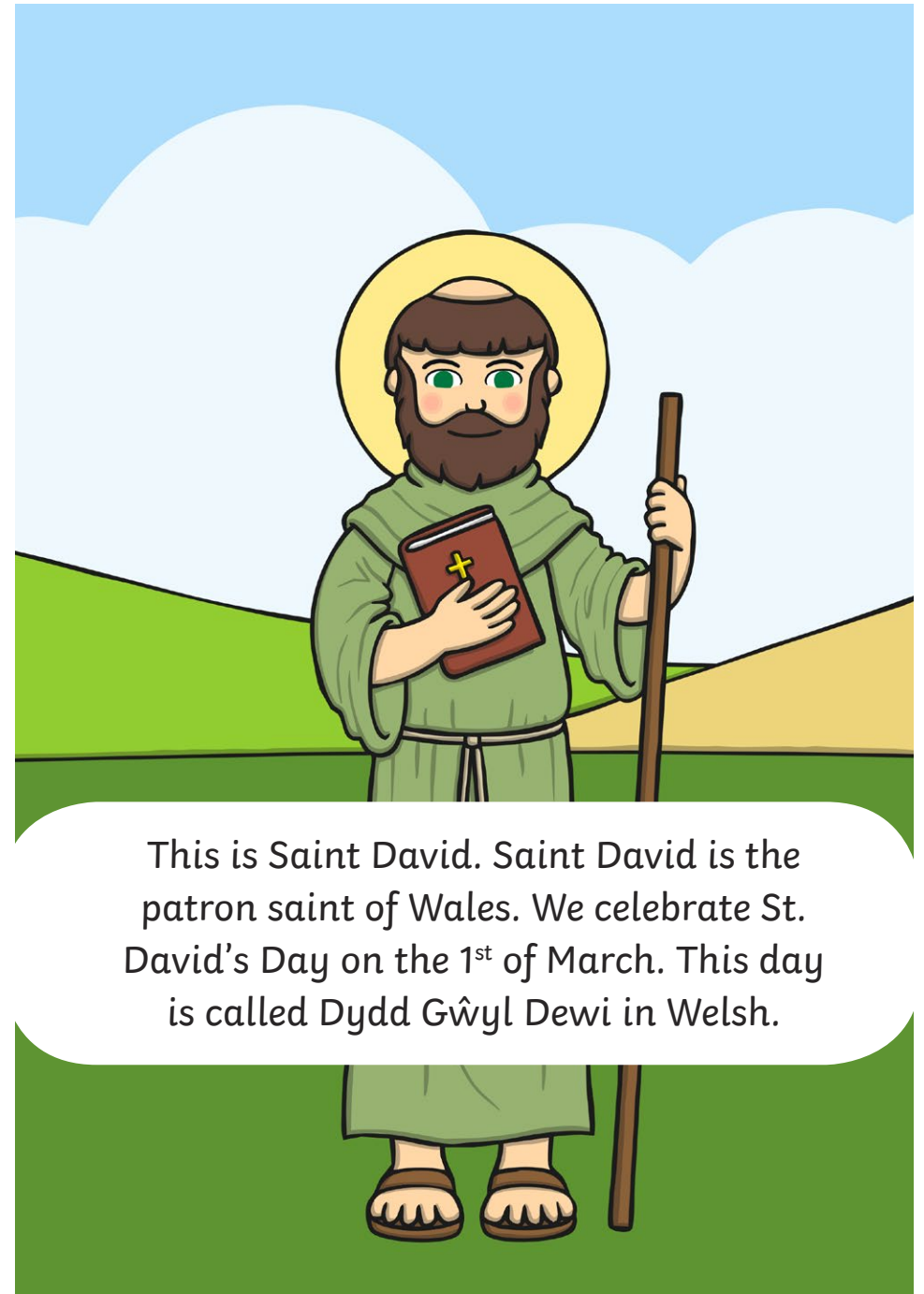


Saint David

Saint David

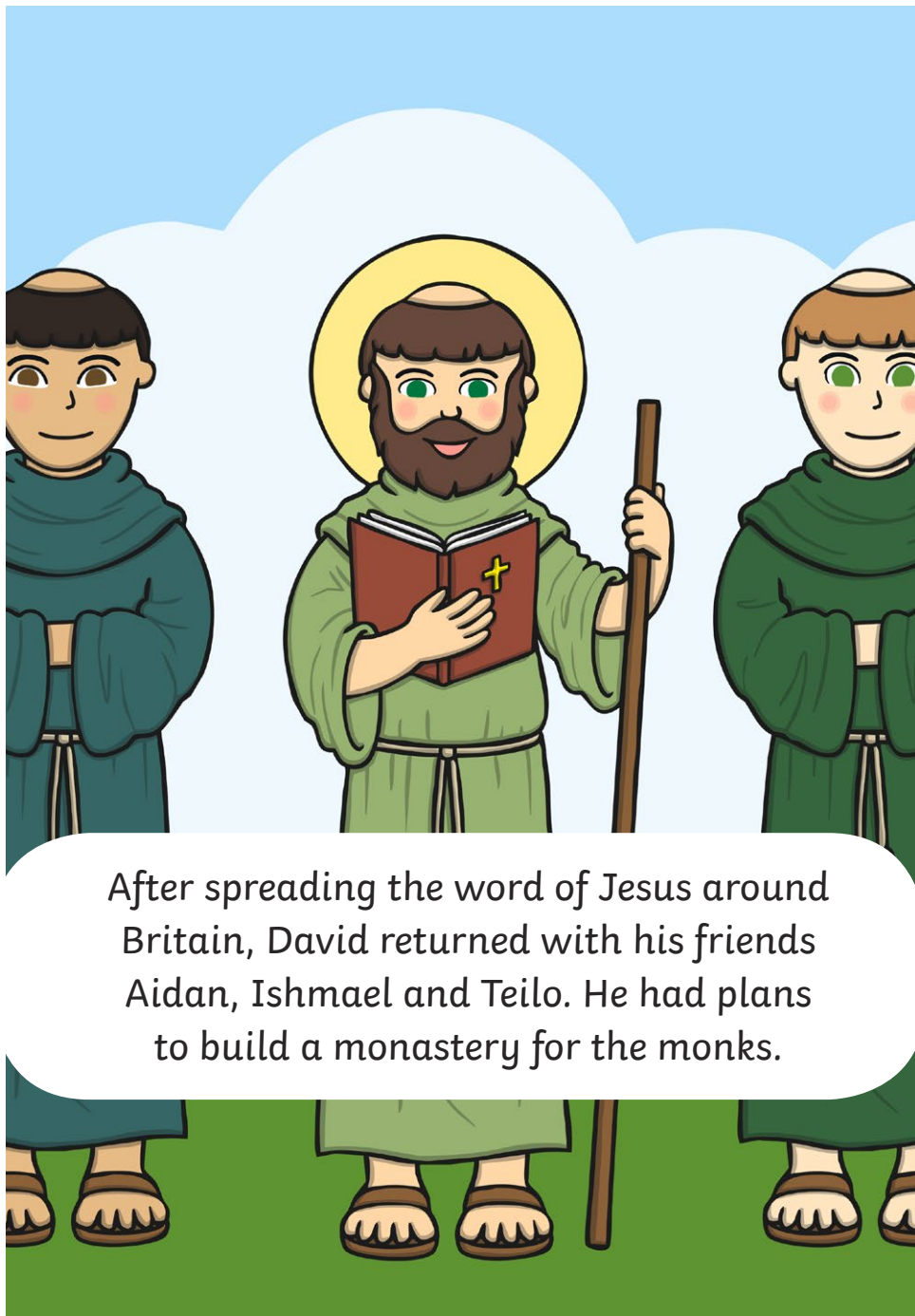


David loved to hear stories about Jesus so he decided to become a monk when he was older. He was a good and kind man.

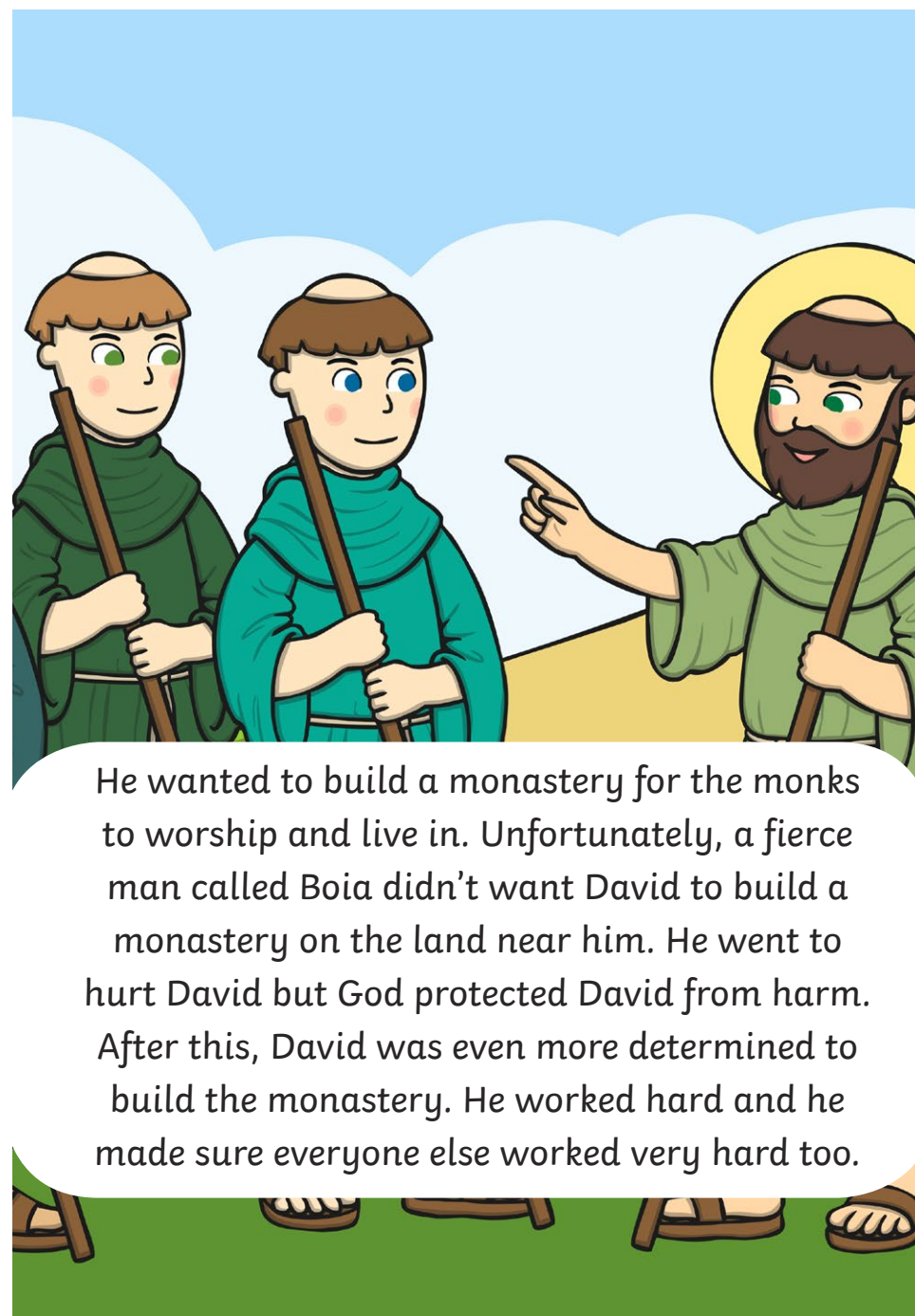
Saint David

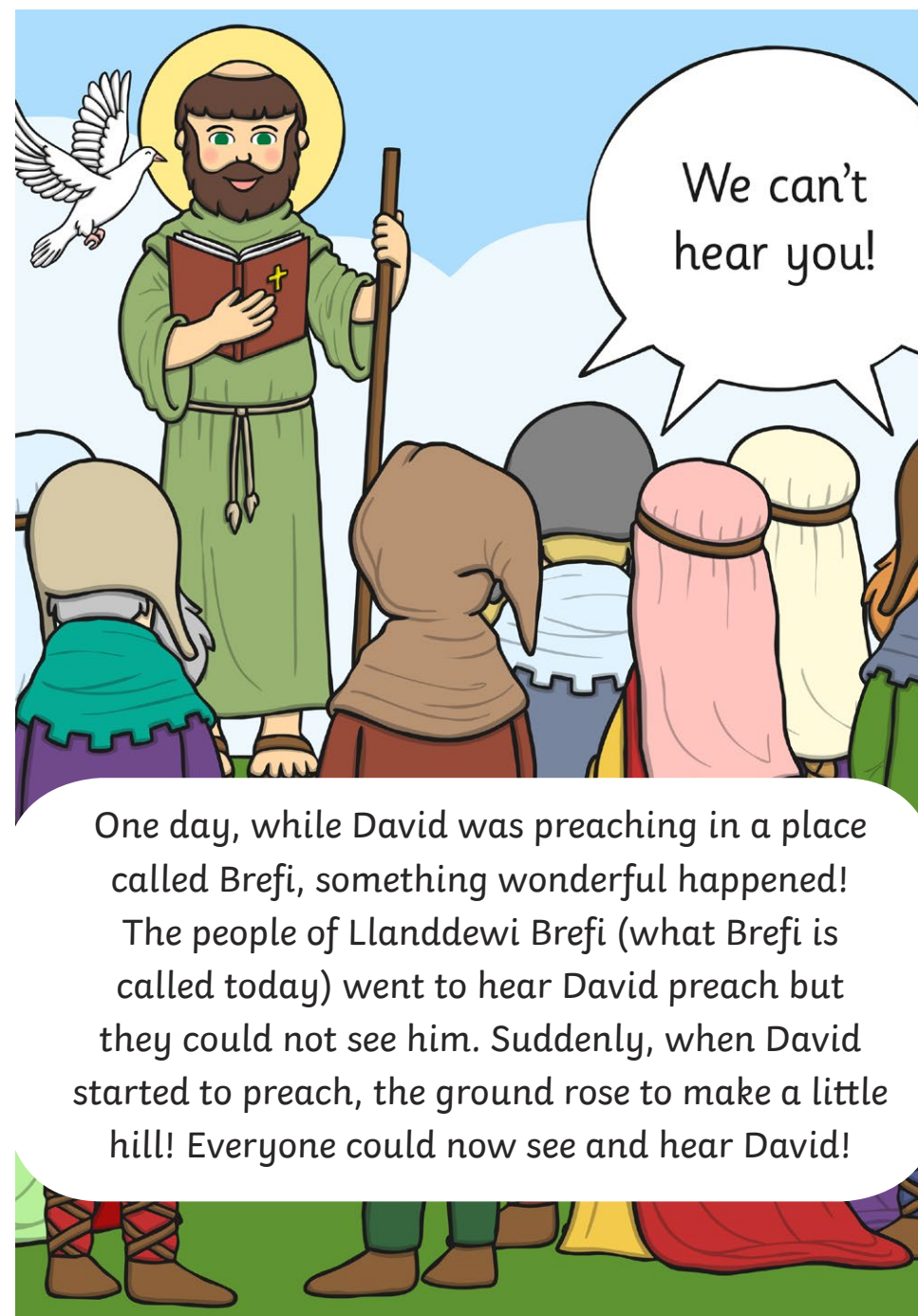
After spreading the word of Jesus around Britain, David returned with his friends Aidan, Ishmael and Teilo. He had plans to build a monastery for the monks.
